What is this guide for?

This guide is for all the Clubs who have requested Overwatch Licenses!

Our Overwatch Licenses are completely free, BUT there are some requirements that need to be fulfilled before you can access our free Overwatch Licenses.

This guide will show you how to add an authenticator to your Blizzard Account.

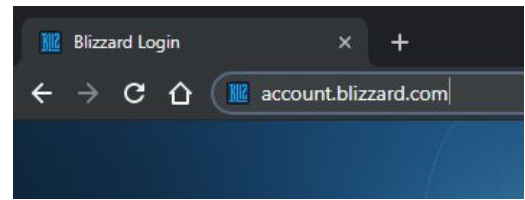
But why do we need to do that? Can't I just log on and play?

Nope! Blizzard requires that you have an authenticator on your Blizzard Account to use our free Overwatch Licenses.

If you already own Overwatch on your account, this guide does not apply to you.

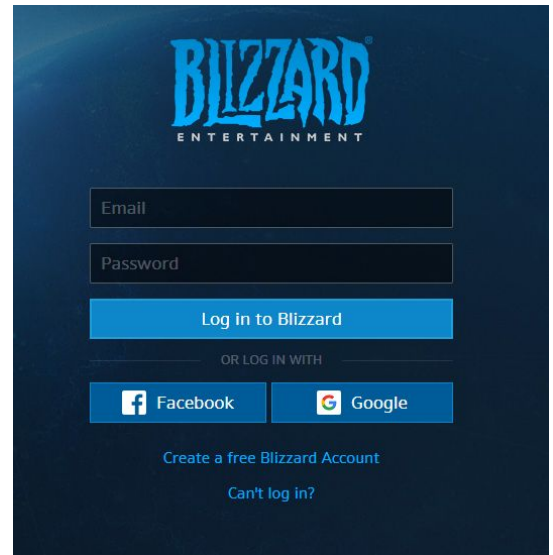


Navigate to the following webpage by entering the following URL in your browser.

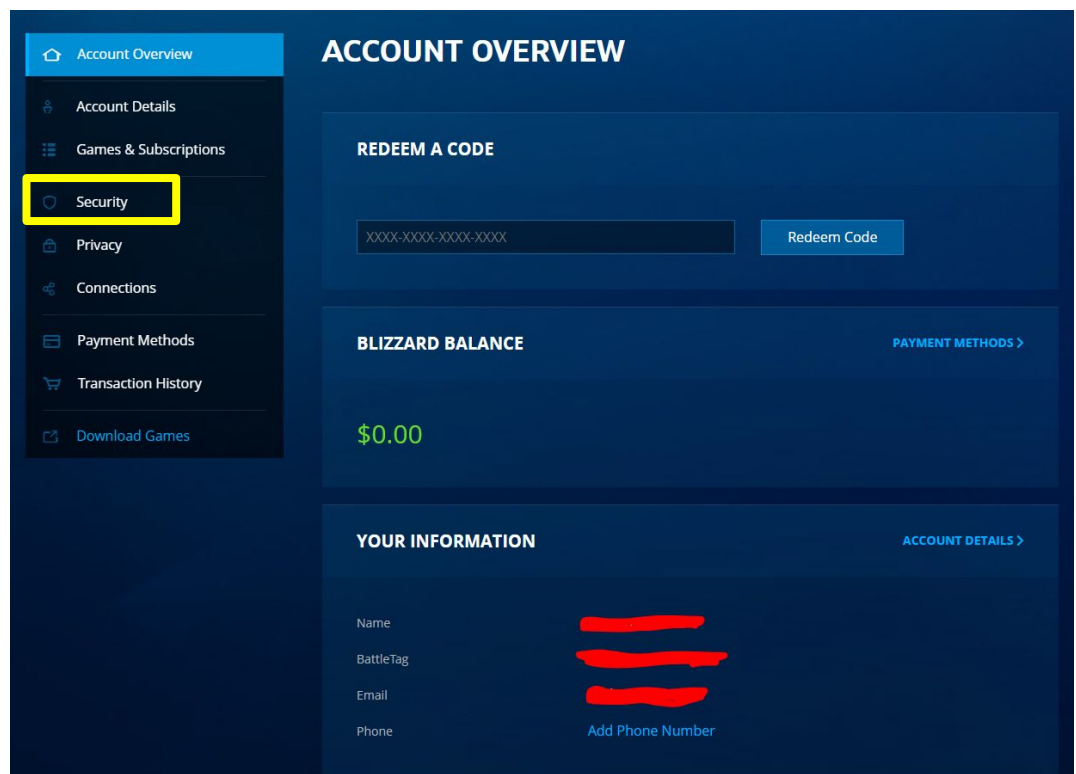


Log in with your Blizzard account information.

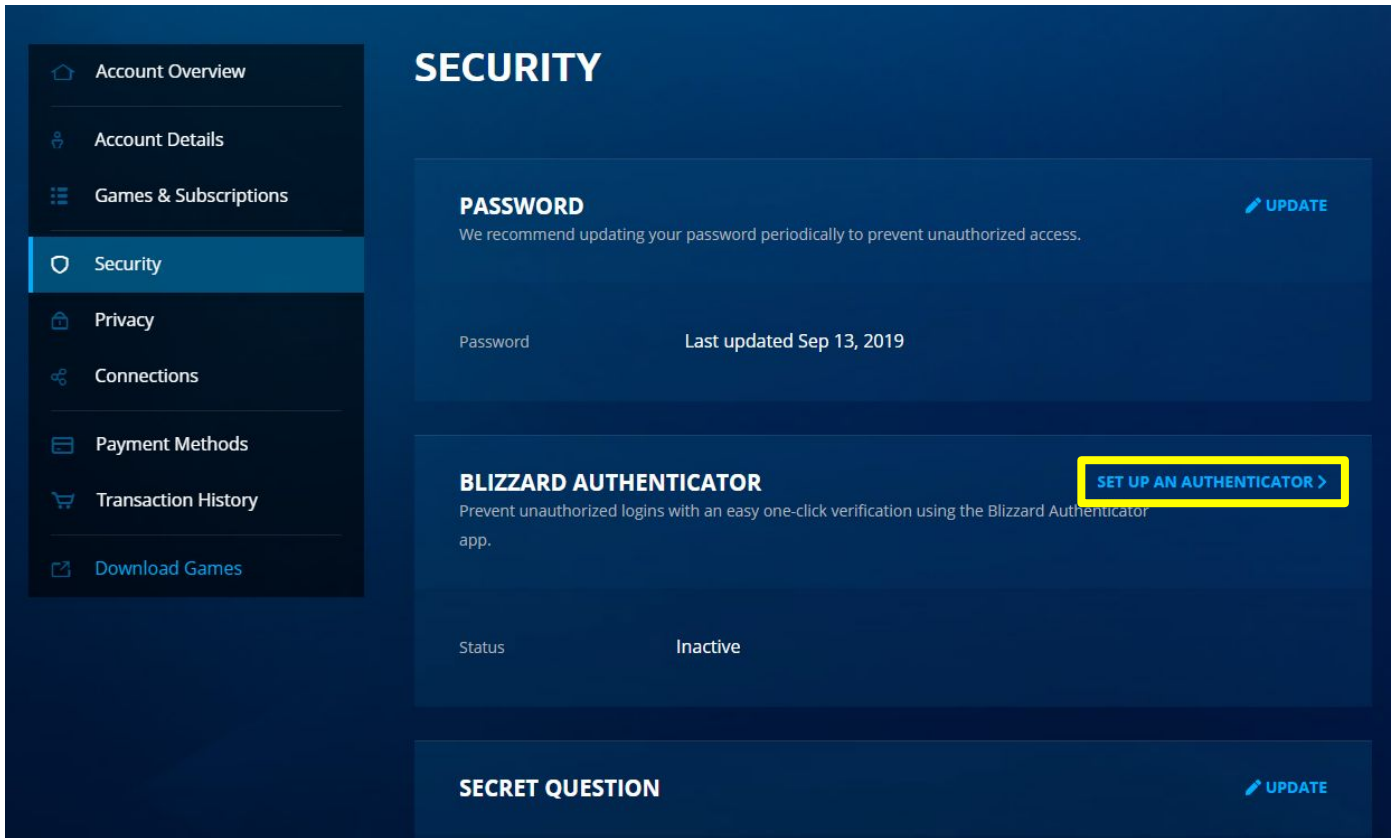

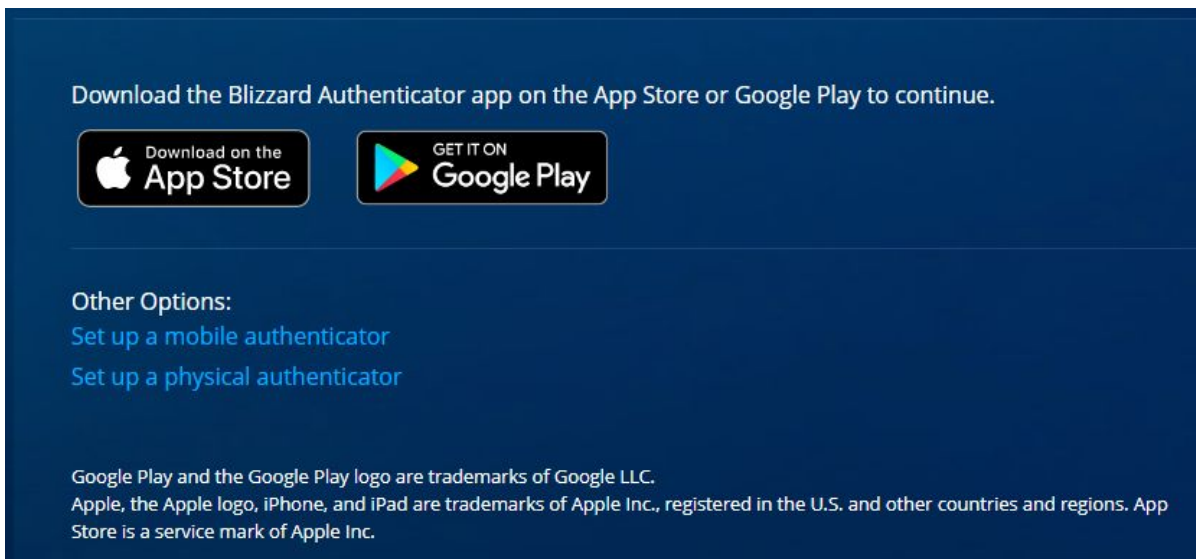
After logging in, it will lead you to this page. Click "Security" on the left sidebar menu.



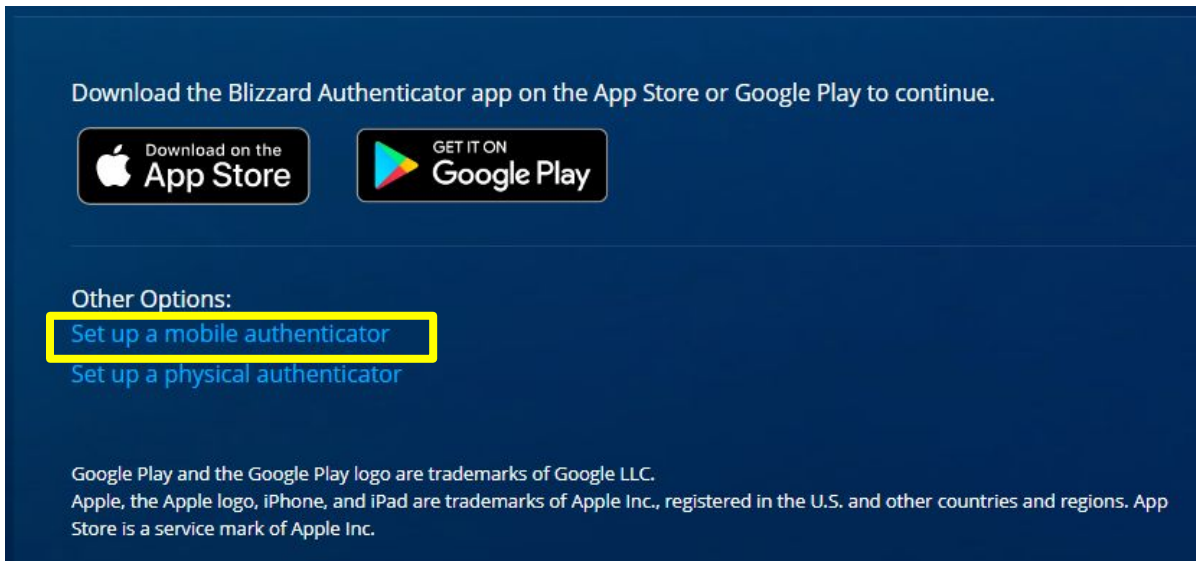
Clicking “Security” will lead you to this page. Click “SET UP AN AUTHENTICATOR” next.



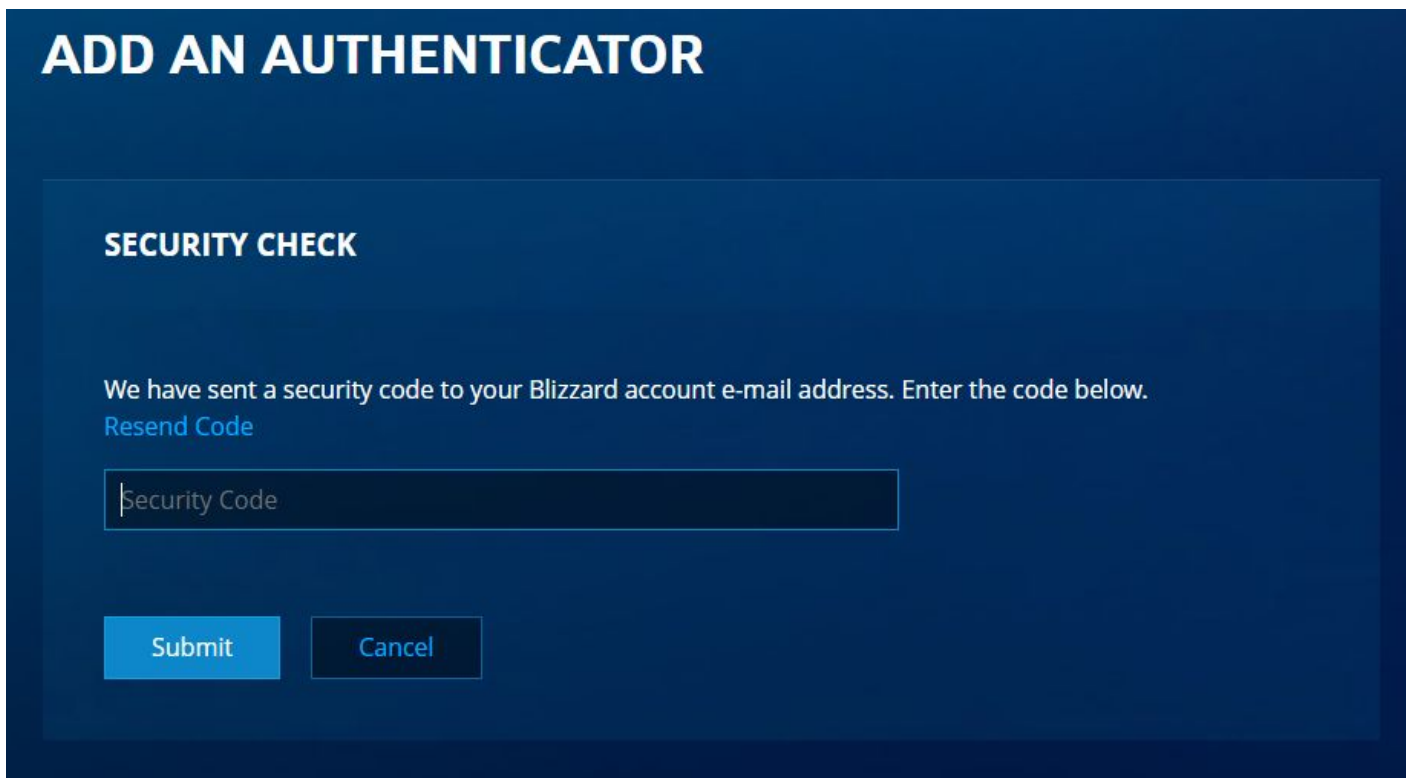
Open up your smart phone and download the Blizzard authenticator app from the app store.




After successfully downloading the Authenticator app on your phone, go back to the “ADD AN AUTHENTICATOR” page here and click “SET UP MOBILE AUTHENTICATOR”



Input the security code you received from Blizzard, in the inbox of the email address you used for your Blizzard account.



After clicking submit, it will lead you to this page. This is asking for the Serial Number and Authenticator Code, which is found on the Authenticator app that you just downloaded!

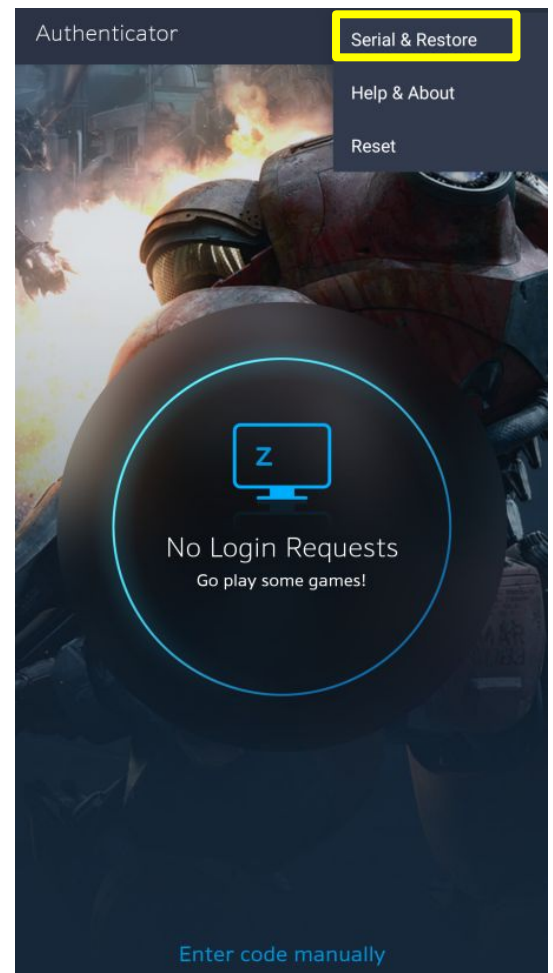
Open the authenticator app.

In the upper right-hand corner of the app, click the three vertical dots. It will open up the menu shown in the screenshot to the right.

Press "Serial & Restore". This is where you will find the Serial Number and Authenticator Code.

If you cannot find the Authenticator code on that page, go back to the Authenticator home page and press "Enter code manually". This should generate a code you can use!

Click "Add Authenticator" after entering the information.



You're all done!

Now you're ready to use our free Overwatch licenses!

Please note that the authenticator will ask you to "approve" your log-in the first time you try to log into the Blizzard Desktop App after you've added the authenticator to your account.
